Pattern Moss Stitch Basket

The pattern describes how:

- 1. to crochet the baskets with crocheted bottom.
- 2. to crochet the baskets with Go handmade's firm bases (PU leather bases).
- 3. to crochet the basket higher or lower.

Incl. tutorial for lining.

Diameter measured at the bottom.

Size: D 15 cm x H 9 cm/Cosy yarn 150 g.

Size: D 18 cm x H 10 cm/Cosy yarn 200 g. Size: D 22 cm x H 11 cm/Cosy yarn 275 g.

Double thread: 8 ddc and 7 dc/10 cm.

Crochet hook: 4,0 - 4,5 mm.



Crocheted in Go handmade's Cosy – A wonderfully soft and high-quality cotton mix that keeps the shape. 60% Cotton/40% Acryl, 50 g/100 m.



Go handmade's felt - a really good choice as linning for the crocheted baskets. The lining gives a special finish, an extravagant look and it keeps the baskets in shape.





GOOD TO KNOW ABOUT THE PATTERN

This pattern is meant to be crocheted with a normal to firm gauge to achieve the correct effect.

Be aware that the final size may vary with a couple of cm more or less depending on your aguare.

If you find the gauge of this pattern challenging, we recommend to use the measuring tape regularly.

Crochet hook: 4,0 - 4,5 mm

Gauge:

Sidepiece: 8 ddc and 7 dc = 10 cm

Bottom: 20 dc = 10 cm

The baskets are crocheted with double thread.

TO CROCHET IN A SPIRAL – WHAT DOES THAT MEAN!

To crochet in a spiral simply means to crochet in continuous rounds. As an example, once you have crocheted the foundation chain as the first part of a basket, the work continues round and round the chain. The most important part of crocheting in a spiral is to continue the rounds without finishing each round with a sl st but continuing around.

For the baskets with firm bottom indicates the number of stitches for the 3 basket sizes.

Sizes:

16 x 10 cm (19 x 14 cm)

18 x 18 cm

Note!

First ch in each row is to create height.

The bottom rounds are finished with sl st in ch.

For each round of the base, add 8 sts.

We recommend placing a stitch marker at the start of each round when crocheting in spiral.

Round 1 to 9 is the same for all 3 baskets.


The height of the basket can be changed by adding x amount of rounds or reducing the number of rounds 12-27 / 15-31 / 18-35.

Guidance on the Magic ring

Method:

- 1. Place the yarn on the 3 middle fingers. Hold the yarn with your thumb. (A)
- 2. Take the yarn once round your fingers so that it makes a cross. (B)
- 3. Insert the hook under the lower piece of yarn. (C)
- 4. Pull the upper piece of yarn under the lower piece of yarn there is now 1 loop on the hook. (D)
- 5. Pull the yarn through the loop on the hook this is the foundation of a magic ring.

 The st on the foundation does not count as a st its function is to pull the magic ring tight. (E)
- 6. Crochet the number of dc's as required by the pattern. (F)
- 7. When the requisite number of dc's have been made, pull the yarn end indicated in grey (G)
- 8. The magic ring is finished, and you continue the work according to the pattern. (H)



Note!

1 ch does not count as any stitch.

It looks like you are skipping a stitch where each round ends. But this is not a real stitch (shown by arrow below).

Cut and weave in the threads.

The basket is now done and ready for the assembling as lining (page 9), handles, labels, etc.

Basket with firm base and holes

Sizes: $16 \times 10 \text{ cm} (19 \times 14 \text{ cm}) 18 \times 18 \text{ cm}$

In principle, it is very easy to crochet from Go handmade's firm bases. There should be 2 dc in each hole on the sides and 3 dc in each corner.

Method:

1.) Start anywhere by crocheting 1 dc in the first hole.
Then 2 dc in the following holes. When you reach the starting point, crochet 1 sl st in the first dc (the one started out with). (73 (97) 105)

From here on the work is done in spiral

Note!

When crocheting in a spiral, there will be an extra stitch in each round – this makes the pattern shift.

Cut and weave in the threads.

The basket is now done.

Fitting of the lining

(with a crochet base)

- Measure the basket's inside circumference and height. Add 5 mm to your measurements.
- 2.) Lay the fabric and draw the measurements of the basket with an addition of


Bottom + 5 mm

Sidepiece = inside circumference + 5 mm

x height + 5 mm

- 3.) Cut out the 2 pieces.
- 4.) Sew the pieces together.
- 5.) Place the lining with the visible stitches facing the inside of the basket. Sew the base with temporary stitches in the row of dc in the back loop. And then sew it at the front just under the 2nd row of sl st using invisible stitches.

The basket is done.



Good to know

Go handmade's collection is developed by the masters themselves - passionate crochets who love their craft.

Hook, size and gauge

All baskets are crocheted with what we consider to be normal to firm gauge. The gauge that we think best suits the baskets.

Crocheters crochet very differently: some crochet with a hook size 2,0 mm and obtain the same size of design and quality as a person who crochets with a hook size 4,0 mm.

We owe this knowledge to the team of crocheters who join us for all our baskets. The key to crochet a specific size is a lot about the crochet style/hands/skills, rather than the size of hook.

Therefore, we will recommend a range of hook sizes up to: 4,0 – 4,5 mm.



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
